## A Message from Father Tom

Dear Grace Episcopal Church,

It is with joy that I write my **second Holy Week/Easter** newsletter! On Ash Wednesday, those who attended the Bible study thought, "let's watch the movie *St. Ralph."* (It's a wonderful coming of age movie about miracles.) As Ralph and his friend Claire enter the church, she turns to Ralph and says, "Don't you just love Holy Week?" Holy Week for those of us who keep it is the most exhilarating, most holy, most time consuming, most exhausting, celebration of the year! **DON'T YOU JUST LOVE HOLY WEEK!** 



Claire radiates joy in her life, as does Ralph in his quest for a miracle. Miracles do happen. People who radiate a permanent joy have given themselves over to lives of deep and loving commitment. Giving has become their nature, and little by little, they have made their souls incandescent. There's always something flowing out of the "interiority" of our spirit. For some people, it's mostly fear or insecurity. For joyful people, it's mostly gratitude, delight and kindness. The celebration of Easter is new life in the face of adversity.

The liturgy intended as the first (and arguably, the primary) celebration of Easter is in the BCP (pp. 284-95). It is also known as the Great Vigil. The service begins in darkness, sometime between sunset on Holy Saturday and sunrise on Easter, and consists of four parts:

- The Service of Light: kindling of new fire, lighting the Paschal candle
- The singing of the Exsultet (this year by Peggy DeLong)
- The Service of Lessons (readings from the Hebrew Scriptures interspersed with psalms, canticles, and prayers) and the Renewal of Baptismal Vows
- · The Eucharist.

Through this liturgy, the BCP recovers an ancient practice of keeping the Easter feast. Way back then, believers would gather in the hours of darkness, ending at dawn on Easter to hear scripture and offer prayer. This night-long service of prayerful watching anticipated the baptisms that would come at first light and the Easter Eucharist. Easter was the primary baptismal occasion for the early church to the practical exclusion of all others. This practice linked the meanings of Christ's dying and rising to the understanding of baptism. (Continued on the next page)

As I write this at St. Mark's Cathedral, Notre Dame is in flames! Of course, the fire we suffered is not as devastating as the Notre Dame fire or the Ward House fire here in St. George. Still, it brings to mind the fact that as Christians (of whatever theology) we are able to rise to new life. This is at bottom the Easter message of all the Gospels and the Old Testament. All Christians this Holy Week are united in sorrow just as we were some 2019 years ago with the crucifixion. We know and agree with St. Paul that "neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

By the time this newsletter is published, Easter will have happened and we will begin a new season of knowing our God is forever with us . . . . . Alleluia!! He is risen. Not only in fact, but in our heart and minds as well.

During Holy Week we learned of the unexpected death of David Southward. With the whirlwind of Holy Week activity and the Southwards' plan to return to Minnesota on Good Friday, there are no plans for a "funeral" here in St. George. In keeping with Barbara's wishes, we will respect her plan to be with her family in Minnesota, to pray for her and to support her in her time of grief.

It is not a contradiction for joyful people to be saddened. As a matter of fact, tears can express joyful love. Our love is the expression of life everlasting in the blessed assurance of resurrection and new life.

To qualify for these programs, you must be over 55 years old, be willing to serve 15 hours per week, meet income requirements (earn less than \$2,000 per month for a single person), and pass a background check.
